# BOARD OF EDUCATION The School District of Independence

The Board of Education met in regular session Tuesday, September 8, 2015, at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room at the Board of Education Office, 201 North Forest Avenue, Independence, Missouri.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. Ann Franklin, and minutes of the meeting were recorded by the secretary, Ms. Annette Miller. Mrs. Franklin welcomed those in attendance including a student from the Truman High School Leadership Class.

Dr. Herl shared a video on the upcoming Truman High School homecoming event and improvements that have been made to the football field at Truman. For the first time in Truman High School's history, they will actually play their homecoming game at Truman. Several people were featured in the video expressing their excitement about this opportunity including former principal, Mr. LeRoy Brown (27 years at Truman High School). He will toss the opening ceremony coin to start the game. Eric Holm, Athletic Director, stated that students, staff, and parents are really excited about the event. He said everyone is welcome to attend and the District will provide shuttles for parking if necessary. He tried to contact the first Truman homecoming queen but she has passed away. Her daughter will be attending the event in her place. Mr. Holm said he graduated from Truman High School and is excited to see the school hosting this event on their own football field.

Blake Roberson made the motion to approve the September 8, 2015 Agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by Greg Finke and unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

There were no patrons or staff that wished to address the Board of Education in open session.

Dr. Herl stated that the list of bills for September totaled \$5,679,807.77 which is about \$500,000 less this month than a year ago. He also said the agenda included letting bids for Phase II of THS stadium renovations.

Denise Fears made the motion, second by Ken Johnston, to approve the September 8, 2015 Consent Agenda as printed.

The motion was unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

Dr. Herl said that it had been a great start for the 2015-16 school year. He is excited about the new hires this year and thanked the H.R. Department for doing a great job. The enrollment is at 14,400 which is up about 180 students from the same time last year. He said that Labor Day may make a difference and he will check on the

enrollment figures again. The State Assessments are in and the results showed the high school academic achievement was the highest in District history. He was pleased overall with the test results but math scores were lower than expected. He said the tests were much more difficult this past year. Mrs. Franklin stated that eight different committees have met numerous times in regards to Core Curriculum. The committee she served on has finished with their meetings and have made their recommendations to DESE.

Items on the Agenda under New Business included information for the Board of Education's consideration.

Dr. Beth Savidge presented information on the District's 2015-16 Assessment Plan. She said that in reality the District is not in the business to test kids and that the Assessments are more about helping students achieve what they can. The District uses the data to create an instructional plan that teachers use to help students. The Elementary calendar has significantly reduced their testing schedule. She explained the different tests that are used for screening and monitoring for academic growth prior to the summative piece in the spring which is the MAP test. She said that the students did extremely well taking the tests on computers last year. The Secondary calendar shows the STAR Reading and Math for grades 6-8; Algebra for 9<sup>th</sup> grade; Biology and English for 10<sup>th</sup> grade; 11<sup>th</sup> grade takes the ACT, and 12<sup>th</sup> grade has American Government. She said the preparation benchmark tests help teachers see what needs to be done in order to meet the academic needs of every child in the District.

Mr. Robert Burkey, Director of Facilities, shared some before and after pictures of District projects. Projects included the following work: asphalt and concrete; flooring – carpet and tile; HVAC units; roof replacements/repairs, pool maintenance, painting, new/replacement cafeteria tables; storage for tables; varsity locker room improvements; doors at THS; and math classroom furniture. Improvements were made through Performance Contract work also: auditorium lighting; speakers; sound system; light boards; air handler at Jim Bridger Middle School; cooling towers; tenant finish at Central Office; and bleachers at William Chrisman and Truman High Schools.

Dr. Herl recommended approving the Regional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. This Plan allows cities and counties to identify possible measures to reduce risks from natural disaster events.

Jill Esry made the motion that the Board of Education approves the Resolution to adopt the Regional Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan as presented. The motion was seconded by Matt Mallinson and approved unanimously by the Board of Education. (Page 10996)

Dr. Herl explained that each year the District is required to adopt a Local Compliance Plan which is consistent with the provisions in the Missouri State Plan for Special Education.

The motion was made by Denise Fears, second by Jill Esry, that the Board of Education approves adopting the Local Plan for Compliance and Part B of the IDEA to provide special education services for all children (between the ages of 3 and 21) who meet the eligibility criteria as stated in this Plan. The motion was unanimously approved by the Board of Education. (Page 10997)

Dr. Herl said the Administration is recommending approval of the District's Assessment Plan as previously explained by Dr. Savidge in her presentation.

Matt Mallinson made the motion that the Board of Education approves the 2015-2016 Assessment Plan as required by the Missouri School Improvement Plan (MSIP) guidelines for the Independence School District. The motion was seconded by Ken Johnson and unanimously approved by the Board of Education. (Pages 10998-11000)

Dr. Herl stated that the District has three (3) mobile units (1 at John W. Luff and 2 at Randall Elementary Schools) that have not had students in them for a number of years and they need to be declared as surplus property and demolished.

Blake Roberson made the motion that the Board of Education approves the declaration of one (1) mobile unit at John W. Luff Elementary School and two (2) mobile units at Randall Elementary School as surplus properties for demolition. The motion was seconded by Greg Finke and unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

Dr. Herl stated that the Administration is recommending approval of 274 bus transportation routes that have been established for the 2015-2016 school year. He said this is a slight increase from last year due to an increase in enrollment and transporting students to contractual placement facilities.

Denise Fears made the motion that the Board of Education approves the 274 Bus Transportation Routes for the Independence School District for the 2015-2016 school year. Jill Esry seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

There being no further information to come before the Board, Blake Roberson made the motion, second by Ken Johnston, to adjourn the meeting and go into executive session for legal, personnel, and real estate issues at 6:49 p.m. The motion was approved as follows:
