BOARD OF EDUCATION The School District of Independence

The Board of Education met in regular session Tuesday, September 14, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room at the Board of Education Office, 201 North Forest Avenue, Independence, Missouri.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Mrs. Denise Fears, and minutes of the meeting were recorded by the secretary, Ms. Annette Miller. Mrs. Fears welcomed those in attendance.

The motion was made by Blake Roberson, second by Carrie Dixon, to approve the September 14, 2021 Agenda as presented. The motion was unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

Mrs. Fears stated that Mrs. Sarah Nelson, INEA President, had requested to address the Board of Education.

Mrs. Sarah Nelson, INEA President, addressed the Board of Education. She appreciates the opportunity to address the Board of Education and cannot find the words to describe this school year. She said it has been an exhausting struggle for everyone. She said she wanted to thank the District for the mask mandate and relying on science, the CDC statements, and data for guidance regarding COVID-19. She said the District is doing what is best for students even in the face of adversity.

Dr. Herl shared that the Bills List for the month of September totals \$18,175,986.63 which is a little higher than normal as it includes various Bond Issue projects payments.

Eric Knipp made the motion to approve the September 14, 2021 Consent Agenda as printed.

Dr. Herl reported that the District is three weeks into the 2021-2022 school year and the staff and administration have done a great job, COVID-19 testing is going down, he continues to meet every Tuesday with the County, and the District's numbers are good and he is not seeing an increase in rates in the schools. He discussed that the District is continuing to experience supply chain issues not only with Bond Issue projects' materials but also with the Nutrition Services' food supplies. Dr. Herl said that Brad Kramer is doing an excellent job feeding students and staff but some menu items are changing due to supply issues.

Several New Business items were presented for the Board of Education's consideration and approval.

Mr. Stutzer provided an update on the Bond Issue projects including pictures of various projects. He shared the progress on the secure entries at Glendale and Sycamore Hills Elementary Schools as they are almost finished. He reported on the improvements of the performing arts areas at Truman and William Chrisman High Schools including the choir rooms, orchestra rooms, auditoriums, stage floors, dressing rooms/makeup stations, new furniture and storage cabinets, improvements to the Lecture Hall at Truman and the Little Theatre at William Chrisman, and renovations to the FACS classrooms. Mr. Stutzer shared pictures of the work that is being done at all three high schools including Van Horn's football stadium renovations, the new high school softball areas, new

tennis courts, parking lot improvements and lighting upgrades at Independence Academy, as well as the renovated front area parking at Van Horn High School. He said that work at all of the projects continues in spite of the challenges in acquiring materials and supplies. Mr. Stutzer stated that some projects will be bid out this fall and may need to be pushed to a third summer of work due to the supply chain issues.

Dr. LeMay reviewed changes in the District's 2021-2022 Assessment Plan. This plan provides teachers data to see students learning progress. FastBridge (includes early reading, early math, aReading and aMath) assessments are given in the fall, winter, and spring for grades K-10. DnA are grade level core content common assessments given at the end of units for K-12 grades. She said that DESE requires the following assessments: WIDA-Access: Grades 1-12. MAP Grade Level Assessments as follows - grades 3-8 (ELA, math); grades 5-8(science); and grades 3-12 MAP-A (ELA, math, science IEP only). DESE requires End of Course Assessments as follows: Algebra I (8th grade and high school); Algebra II; Biology; English II; and Government. If students are quarantined, assessments will be given when they return. She said Assessment options will also be provided for virtual students.

Jill Esry made the motion, second by Eric Knipp, that the Board of Education approves the 2021-2022 Assessment Plan, as required by the Missouri School Improvement Plan (MSIP) guidelines, for the Independence School District. The motion was unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

Dr. Stout explained that the District's transportation routes are determined each year from student lists provided by each school. This year the District has 229 routes and is still operating on a three tier program.

Blake Roberson made the motion, second by Greg Finke, that the Board of Education approves the 229 Transportation routes for the Independence School District for the 2021-2022 school year. The motion was unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

Dr. Herl said the Administration is recommending approval of the Local Plan for Compliance and the Assurance Statements for Sec. 613 (Part B) of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) for 2004, for the 2021-2022 school year as presented.

Matt Mällinson made the motion, second by Carrie Dixon, that the Board of Education approves adopting the Local Plan for Compliance and the Assurance Statements for Sec. 613 (Part B) of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) for 2004, to provide special education services for all children (between the ages of 3 and 21) who meet the eligibility criteria as stated in this Plan for the 2021-2022 school year. The motion was unanimously approved by the Board of Education. (Page 12155)

Dr. Stout explained that the Administration is recommending approval of the quote from REI (Radio Engineering Industries) to purchase 33 Digital Video Recorders, 48 2TB storage units, and 101 Wi-Fi antennas to be used on the buses at a cost of \$89,597.38. This cost includes installation of the new equipment and a discount in the amount of \$30,117 for returned equipment. Dr. Stout said REI is a member of the TIPS USA Coop and that the new equipment will make viewing videos much easier.

Eric Knipp made the motion, second by Blake Roberson, that the Board of Education approves the quote from REI (Radio Engineering Industries) for an upgrade of Video Surveillance Systems for buses at a cost of \$89,597.38 which includes a discount of \$30,117 and installation. The motion was unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

Dr. Stout reported that three bids were received for Disaster Recovery Services for the District. The Administration is recommending entering into a contract with two companies: Serv Pro as the primary service provider and First Onsite as the secondary or backup service as needed.

Jill Esry made the motion that the Board of Education approves entering into a contract with Serv Pro as the primary service and First Onsite as the secondary service to provide the District Disaster Recovery Services as needed. The motion was seconded by Greg Finke and unanimously approved by the Board of Education.

Dr. Stout stated that the Administration is recommending extending the contract with SumnerOne for digital copiers, supplies, and services. He said this would be a savings of over \$52,000 during the next 36 months and would provide an upgrade to the copy machines in the District's Print Shop.

Blake Roberson made the motion that the Board of Education approves the two (2) year contract extension with a color print shop upgrade bid from SumnerOne. The motion was seconded by Eric Knipp and unanimously approved by the Board of Education.
