Analyze the psychological impact the principles and elements of design have on the individual. Analyze the principles and elements of design on aesthetics and function. Critique design plans to address clients' needs and resources. Justify design solutions relative to client needs, including diversity and cultural needs, and the design process.
Unit 5: Floor Plans	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Evaluate floor plans with efficiency and safety in areas including but not limited to zones, traffic patterns, storage, electrical, plumbing, ventilation, and thermal systems. Arrange furniture placement with reference to principles of design, traffic flow, activity, and existing architectural features. Demonstrate graphic communication skills.
